Dear Chairman Grassley and Ranking Member Wyden:


As the organization representing all 50 state departments of transportation (state DOTs), the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) writes to urge the Senate to reauthorize the next long-term surface transportation bill on time upon expiration of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act on September 30, 2020.

Over the past two years, AASHTO members developed and adopted five core policy principles related to surface transportation reauthorization: enact the next bill without relying on disruptive short-term extensions; find a long-term and sustainable revenue source for the Highway Trust Fund; increase and prioritize formula-based funding; increase flexibility, reduce program burdens and improve project delivery; and support and ensure the ability to harness technology in the future. The Senate Environment and Public Works (EPW) Committee passed its portion of this important legislation—America's Transportation Infrastructure Act (ATIA)—in July of last year and we are grateful to see this legislation in very strong alignment with AASHTO's highest policy priorities.

Now is the time to bring together the work of the all key Senate Committees—including the Senate Committee on Finance (Committee)—in order to reauthorize the next surface transportation legislation. With the first critical step having been taken by the EPW Committee's unanimous passage of the ATIA, we look forward to working with the Committee as you continue to develop your funding and financing proposals to support the next multiyear highway, highway safety, transit, and passenger rail authorization on time.

AASHTO members stand ready to help you and your colleagues as the reauthorization process continues.
